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Lao Zi (c. 580-500 B.C.) and Confucius (551-479 B.C.) havetraditionally been regarded as the two most celebrated thinkersin the history of Chinese philosophy. The former is considered the founder of Daoism (i.e. Taoism), and is studied worldwide, mostly by scholars, whereas the latter, the founder of Confucian-ism, is venerated by people of all walks of life and all over theworld. As has been observed by both oriental and occidental readers (including Hegel), the ideas of Lao Zi tend to be more philosophical in the pure sense of this term when compared with those of Confucius. It is commonly acknowledged that Lao Zi'sphilosophizing underlies the structure or formation of the overall psychology of the Chinese people.
