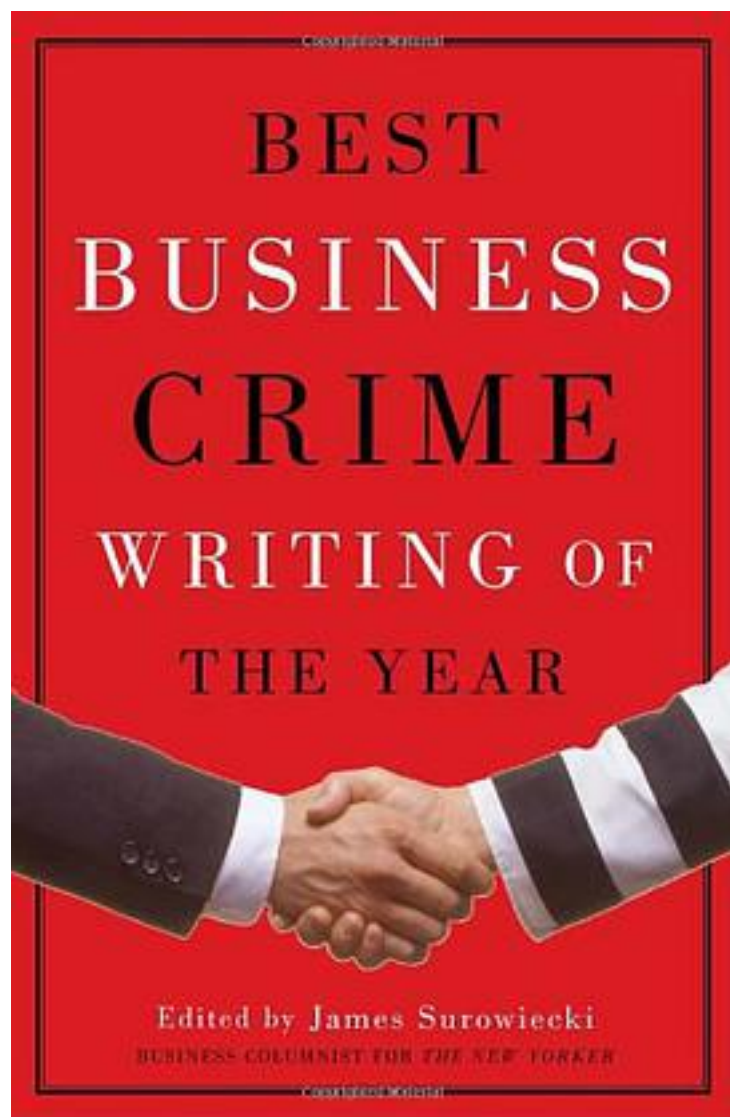


Best Business Crime Writing of the Year
