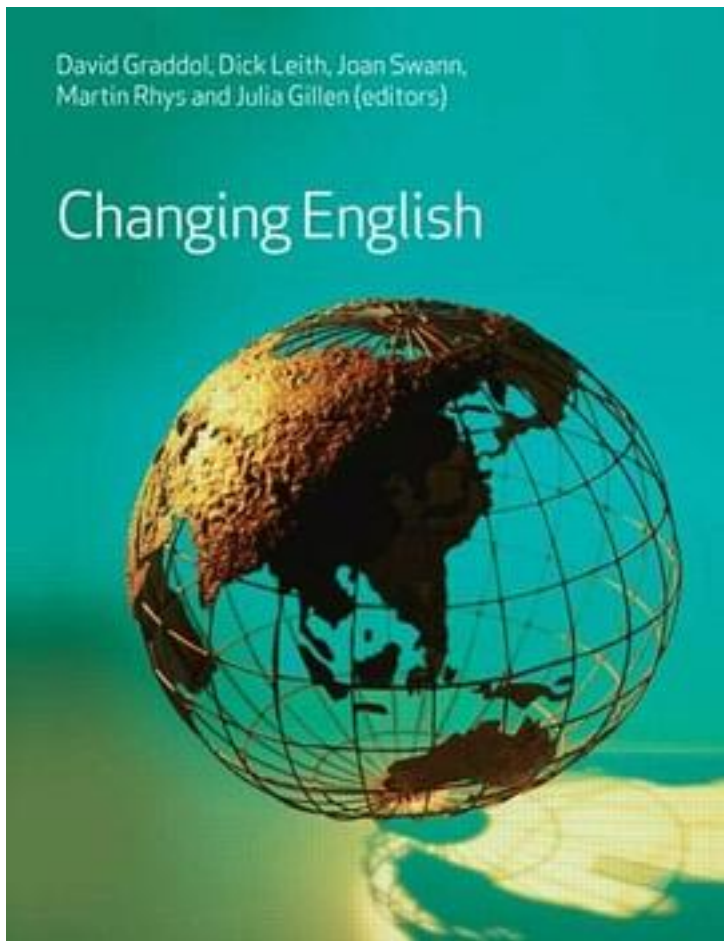


Changing English
