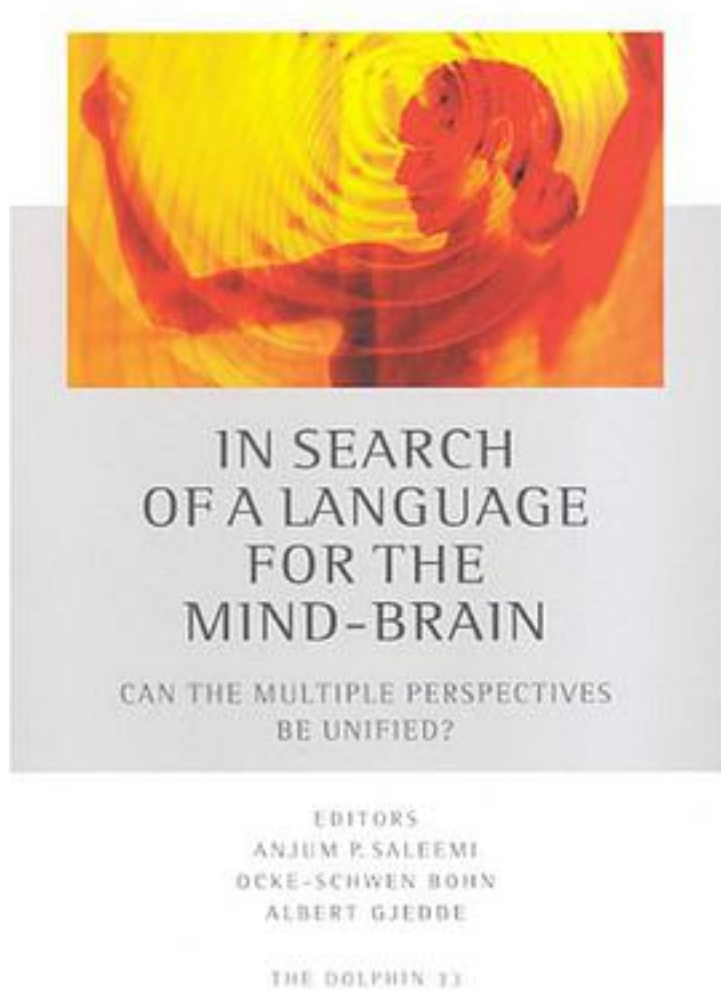


In Search of a Language for the Mind-Brain
