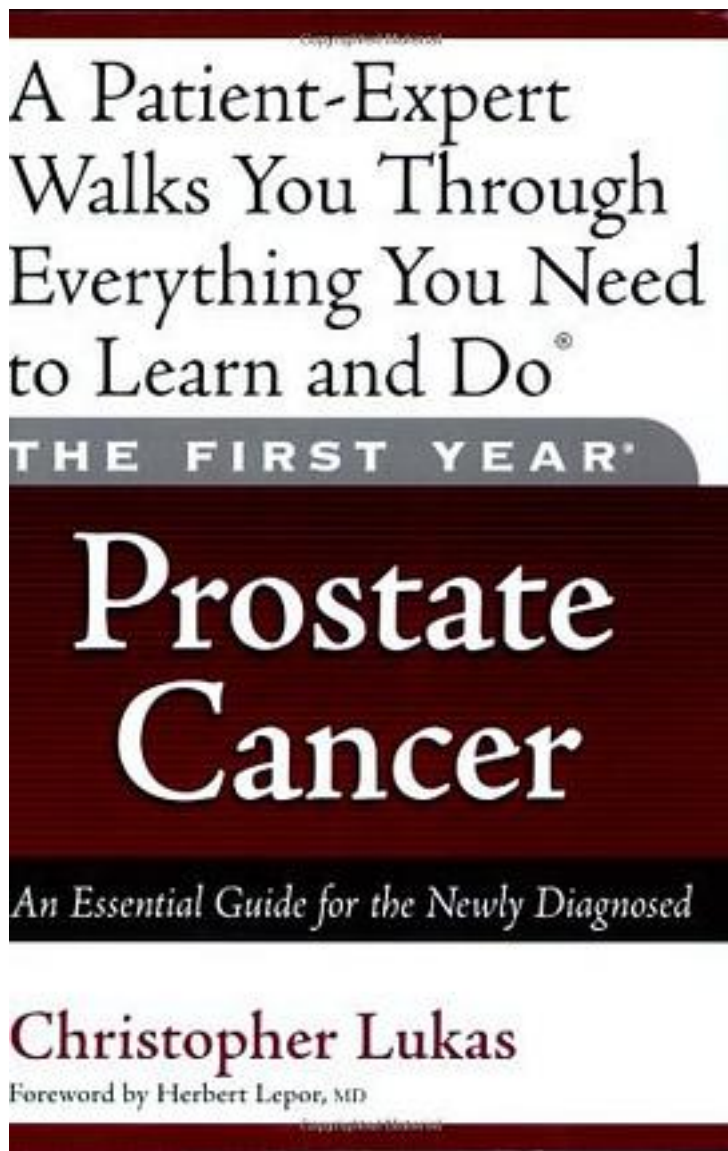


The First Year
