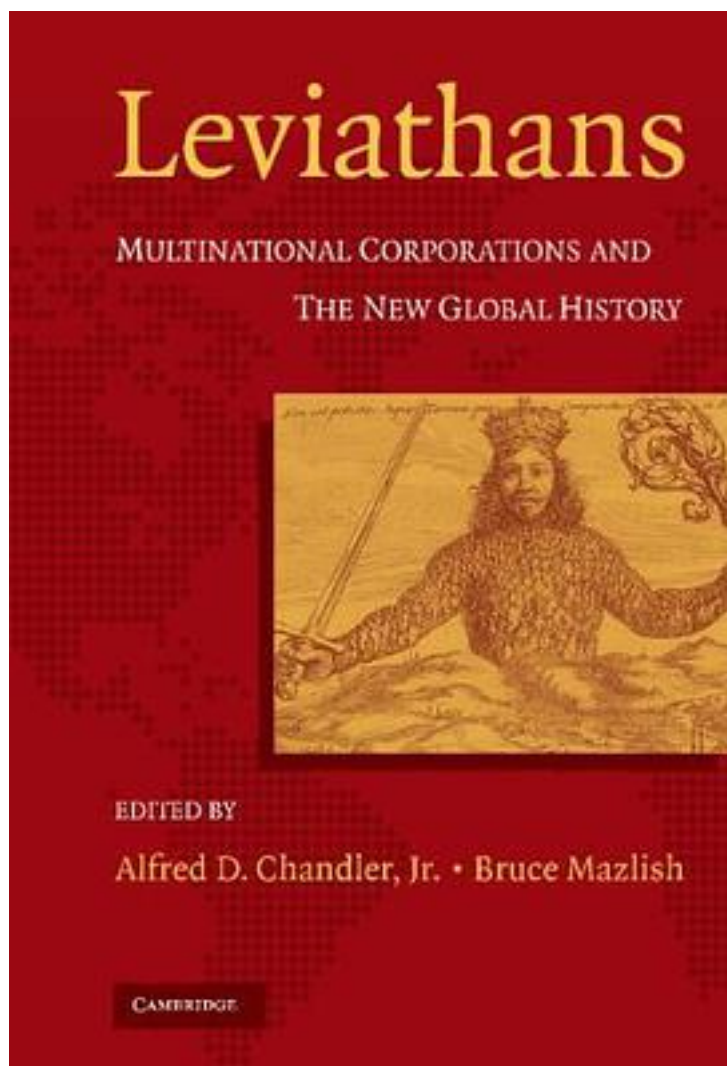


Leviathans
