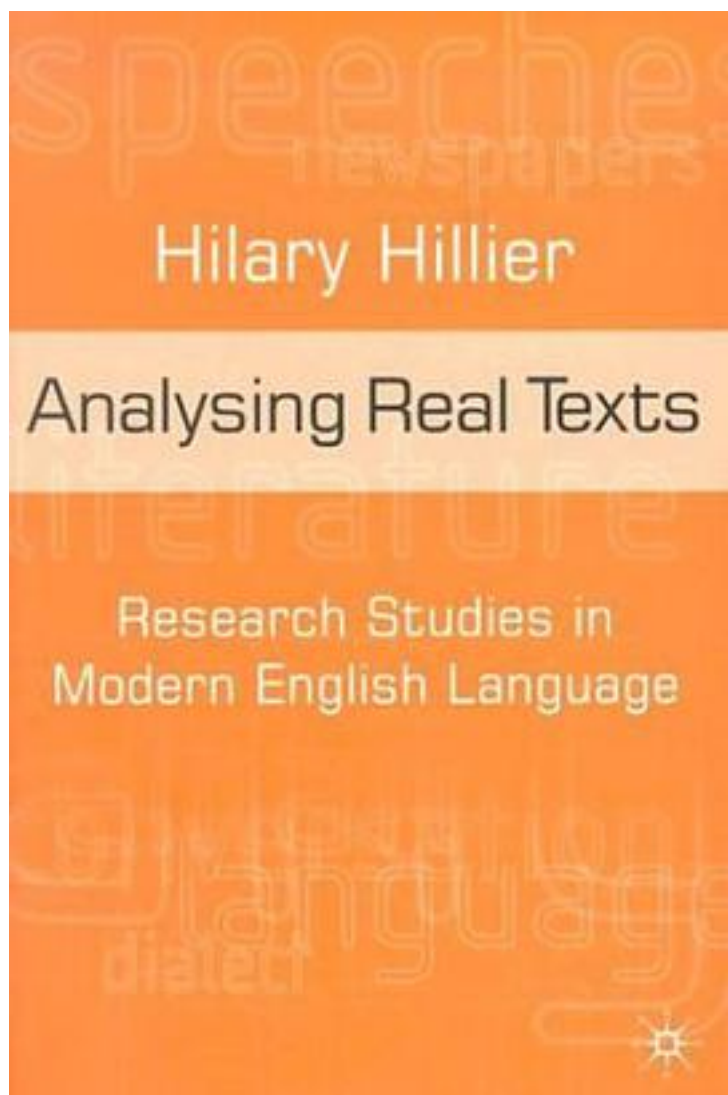


Analysing Real Texts
