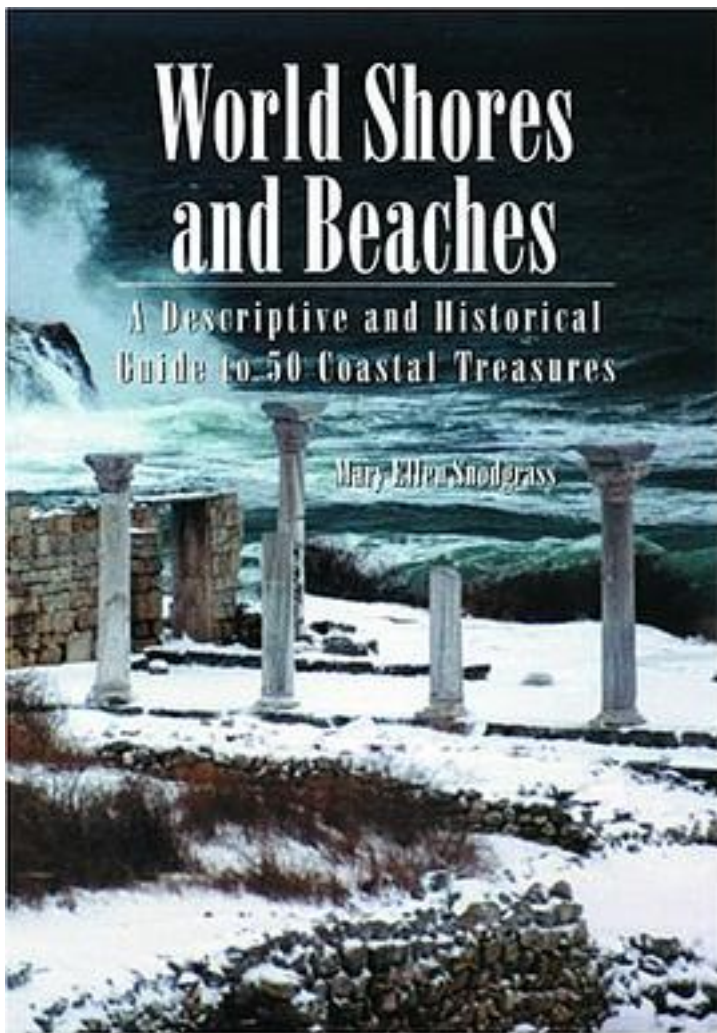

Much diversity exists among the beaches and shores of the world. Some have features
