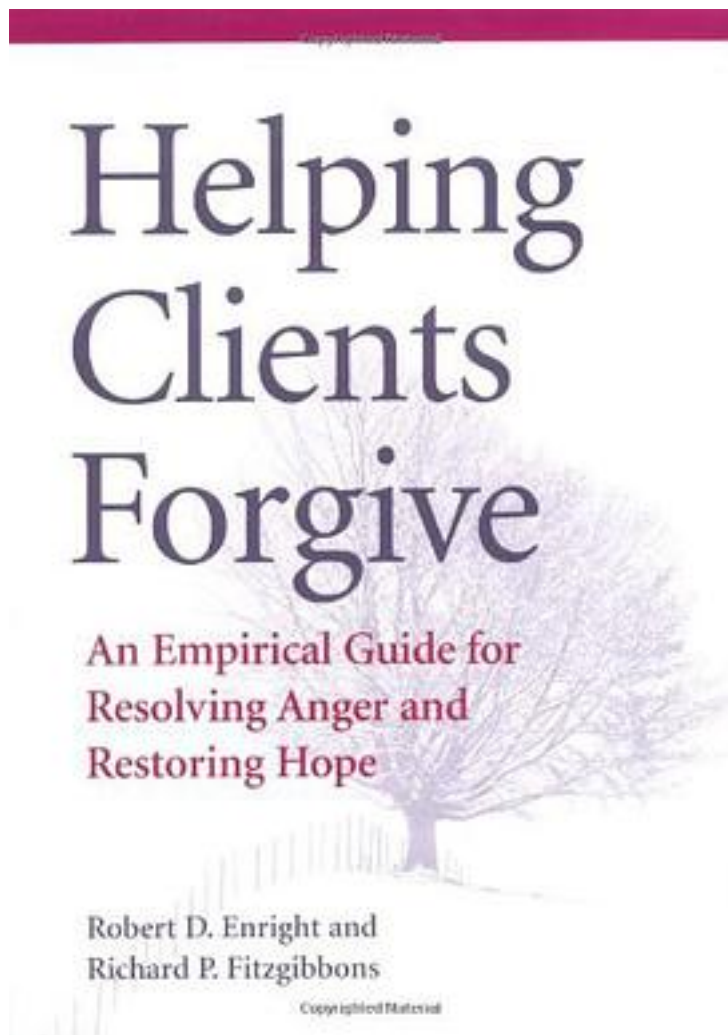


Helping Clients Forgive
