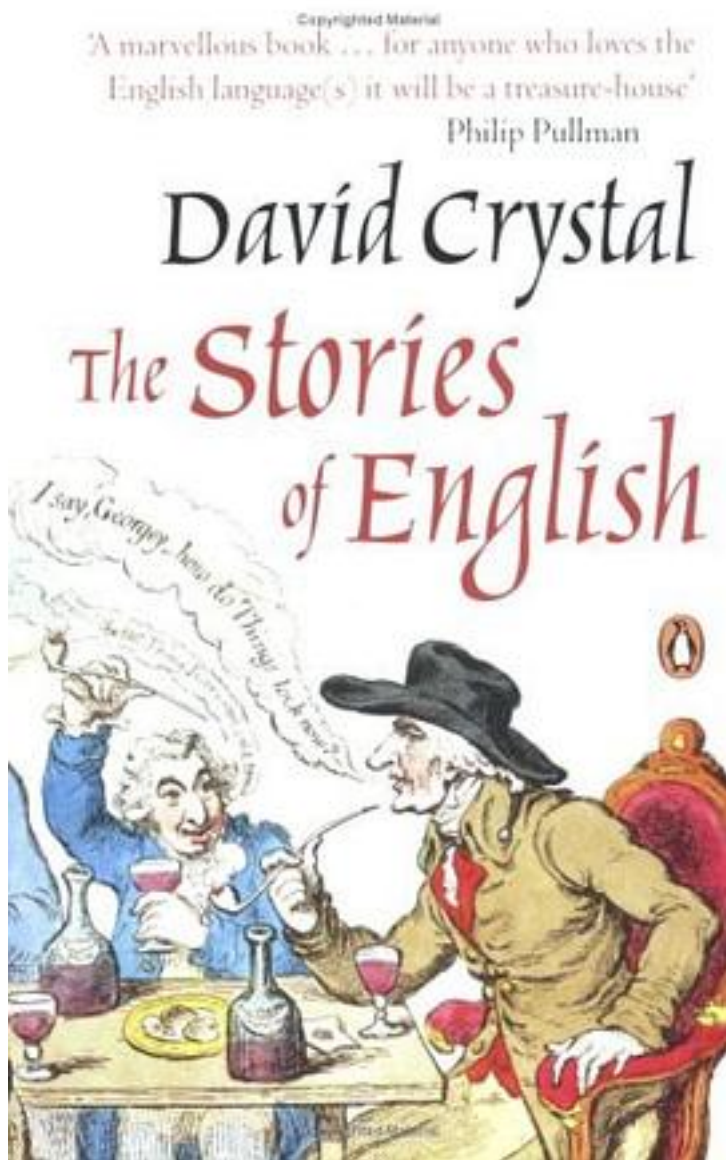


The Stories of English
