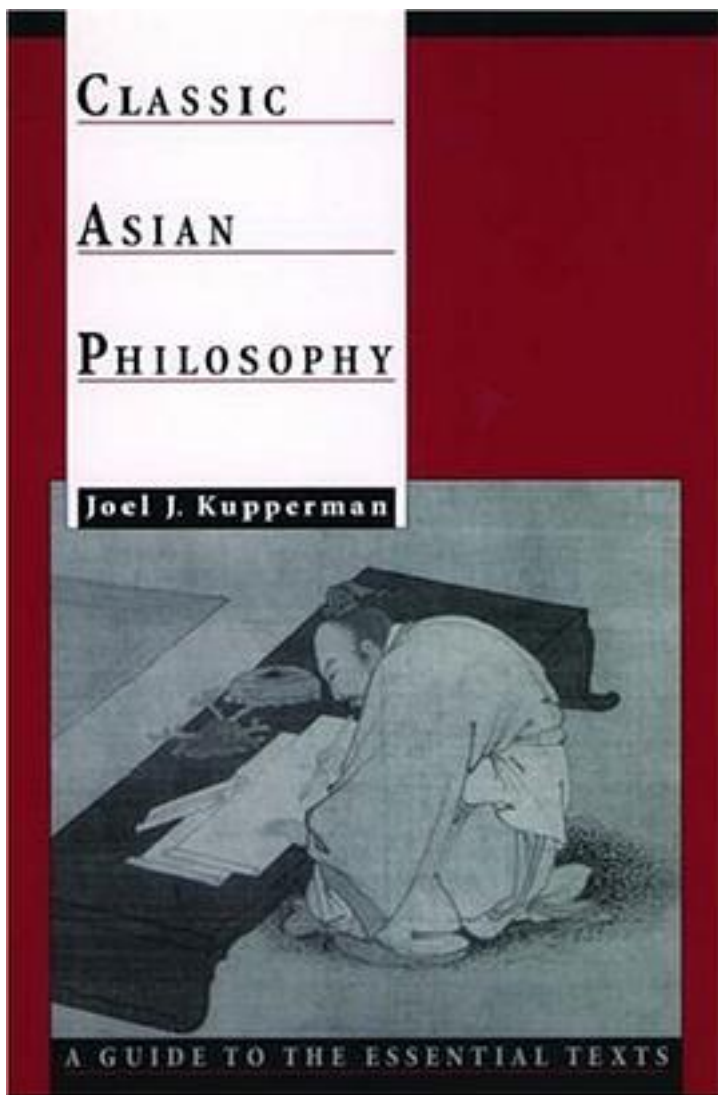


Classic Asian Philosophy
