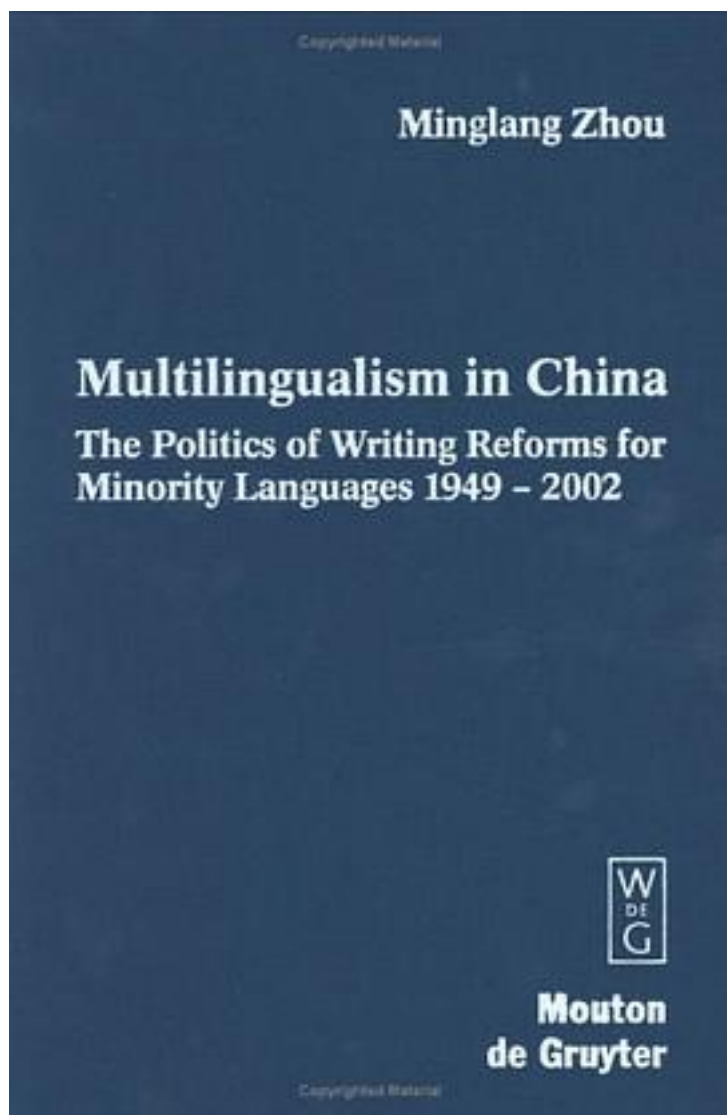


Multilingualism in China
