Goodson opens with an autobiographical introduction to a range of curriculum studies, which pioneered a new way of studying schooling, and he contextualizes his selection within the development of the field. Chapters in this prestigious book cover: curriculum history and policy; classroom pedagogy and strategies for professional development; and life history, narrative and educational change.

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
