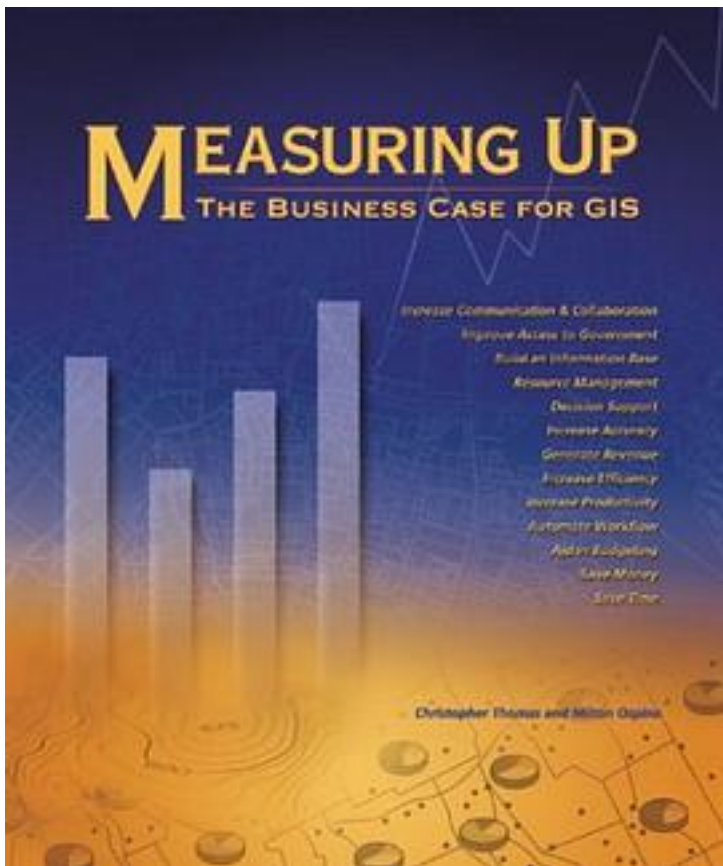


Measuring Up
