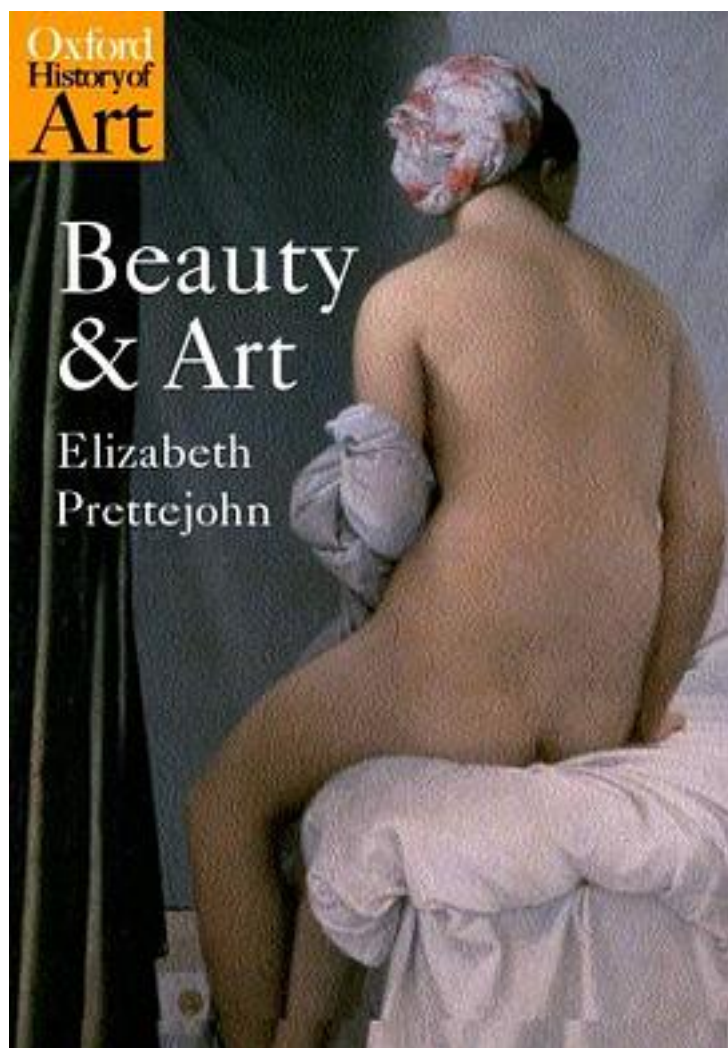


Beauty and Art
