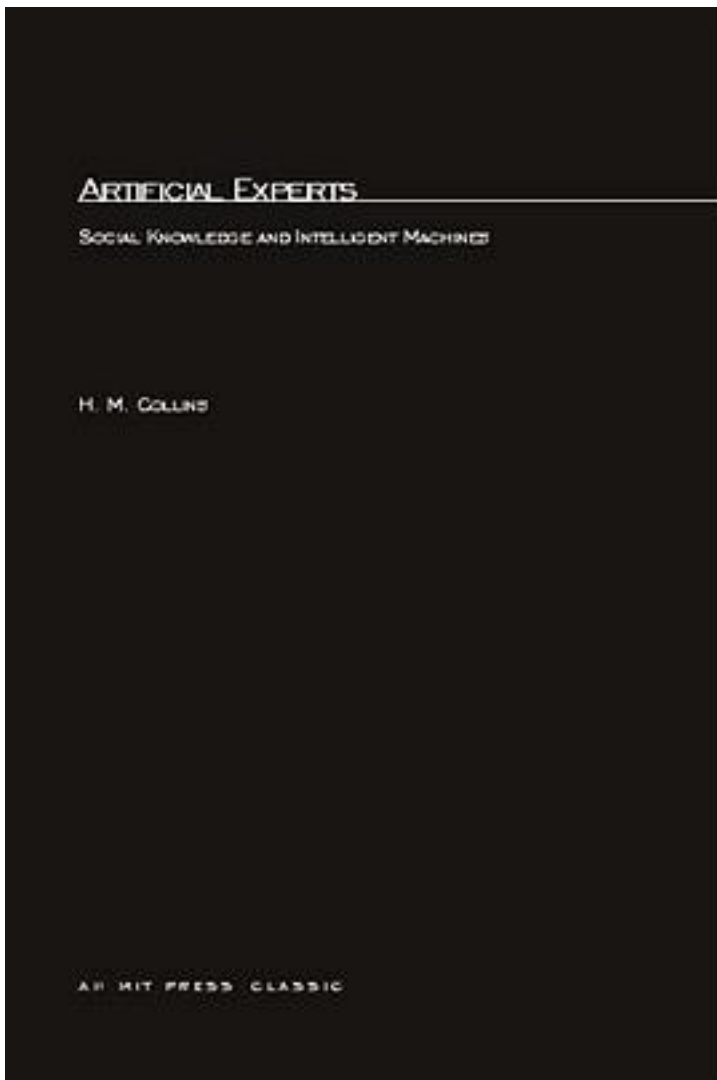


Artificial Experts



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In Artificial Experts, Collins explains what computers can't do, but he also studies the ordinary and extraordinary things that they can do.
