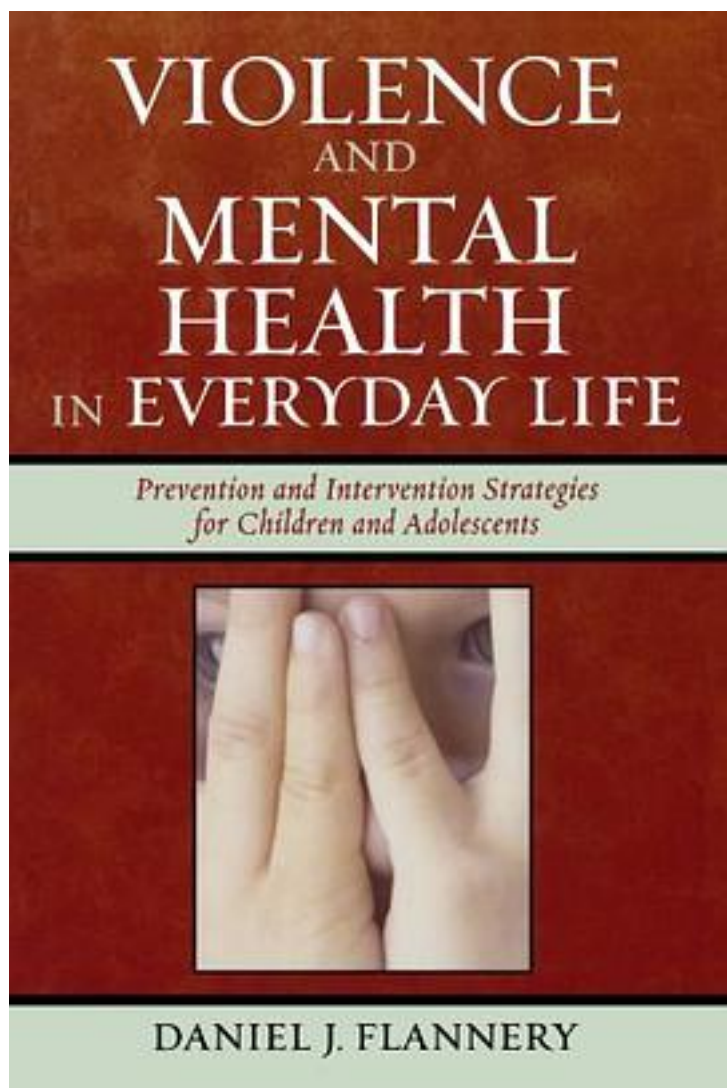


Violence and Mental Health in Everyday Life
