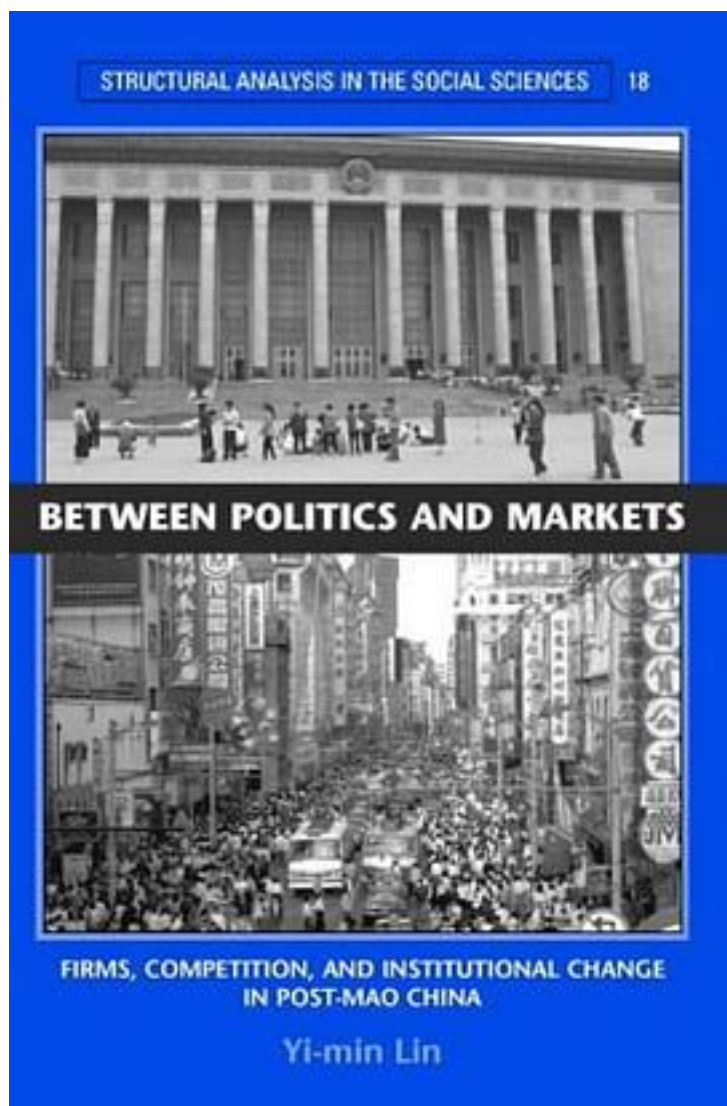


Between Politics and Markets
