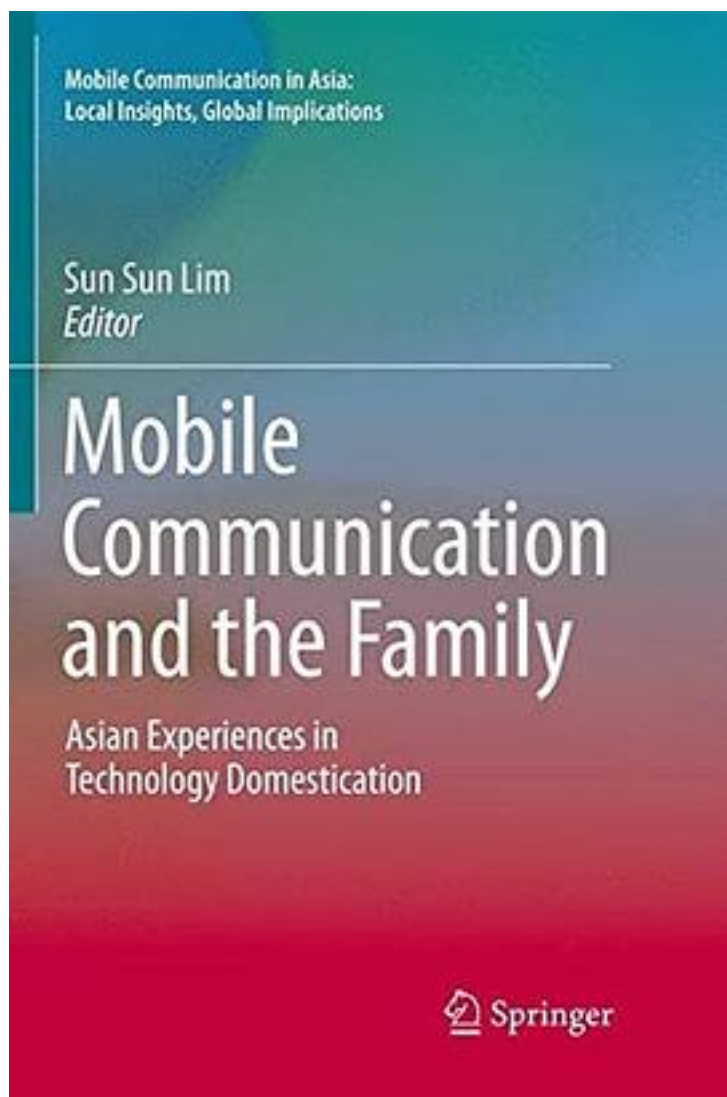


Mobile Communication and the Family
