 neighbori¼Œ I thank you. The next year Prime

Statesman of the Year Award\" in New York.
 John F. Kennedy had said about Cana-
 da: \"Geography made us neighbors. His-
tory made us friends. And economics
made us partners.\" A quarter century lat-
br >er, President Ronald Reagan made no se-
-cret about his reasons for meeting with the
-Canadian prime minister in March 1985, a
practice that is usually repeated twice a
year: \"No other country in the world is
more important to the United States than
Canada, and we are blessed to have such < br > a nation on our northern border.\" In both < br >his terms in officei¼Œ his first foreign trip
>br >was to Canadai¼Œ and Brian Mulroney visit-
br >ed the President in Washington on his
br >eighth day as Prime Minister of Canada.
 The first foreigner to fly into space with < br > American astronauts was a Canadianii¼Œ
Marc Garneau. He worked at NASA the
rest of the century and flew his third shut-
tle mission in 1999. Other Canadians
served in the space station (Julie Payette)
or walked in space (Chris Hadfield).
 Canada is the only foreign country that br >is permitted to locate its embassy on br >Pennsylvania Avenue. Former Canadian < br > Ambassador Derek Burney had this to say < br > about the modern building, opened in
1989 and situated halfway between the
White House and the Capitol: \"It conveys
the message that I want to convey: Cana-
