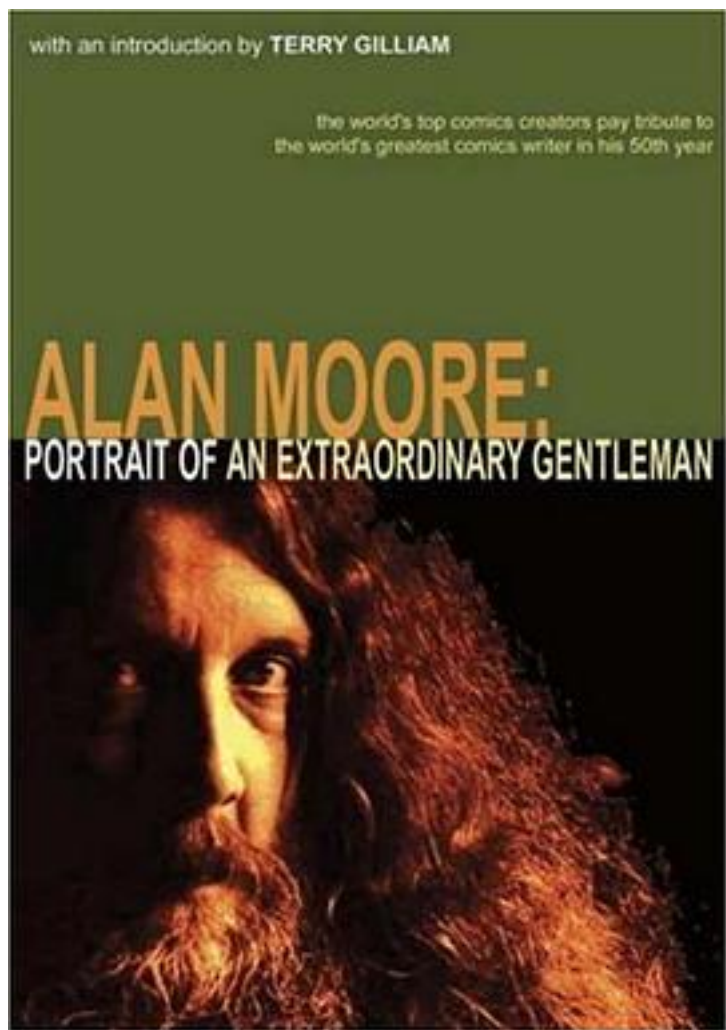


# Alan Moore
