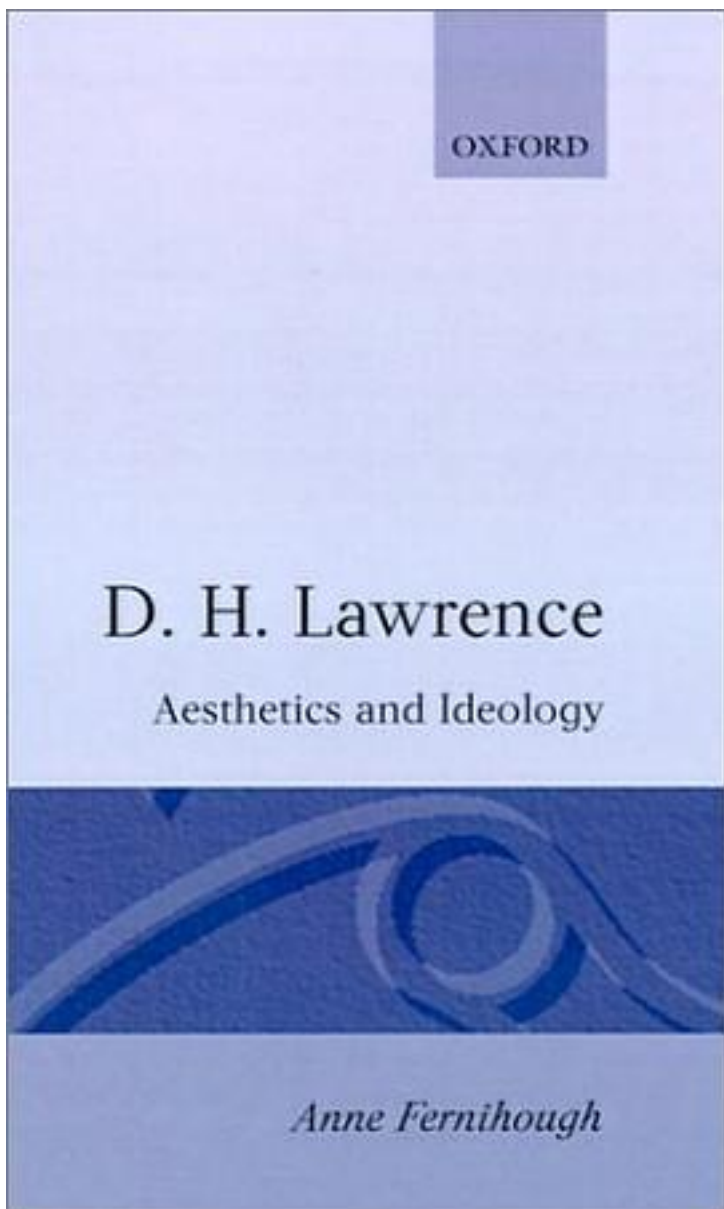

D. H. Lawrence once wrote that 'we have no language for the feelings'.
