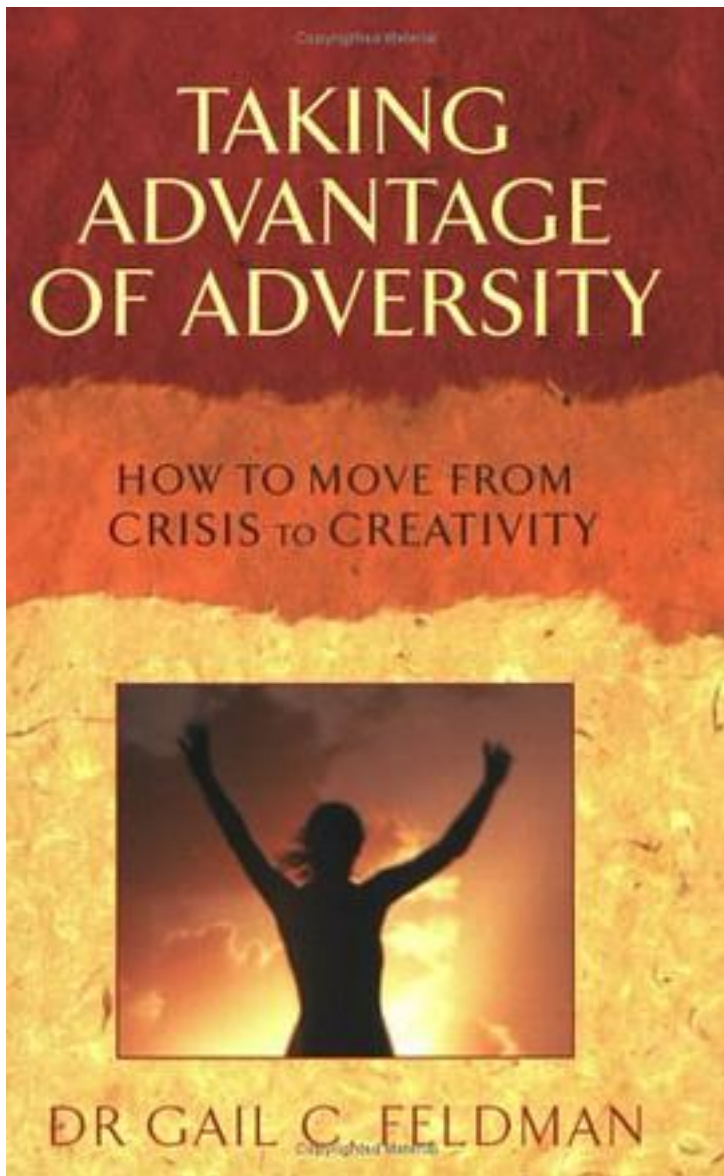


Taking Advantage of Adversity
