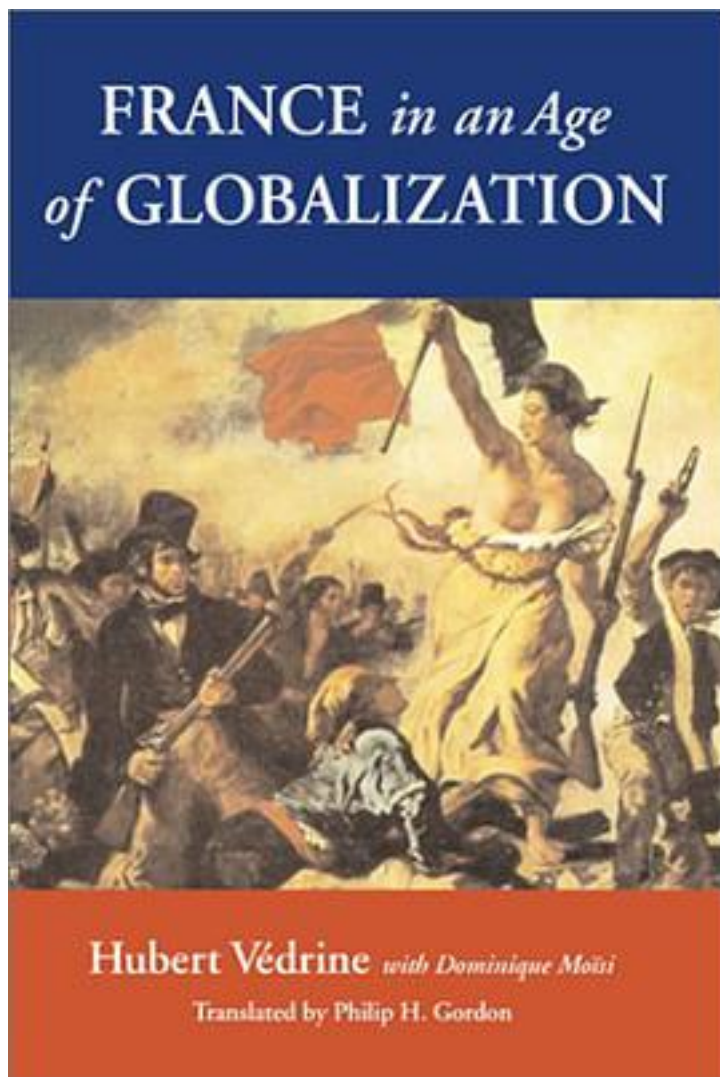


France in an Age of Globalization
