an African-American culture, and much more. But though centered on the United States, the book offers a global perspective spanning four continents. Equally important, it combines the subjects of slavery and abolitionism as very few books do, and it connects the actual life of slaves with the crucial place of slavery in American politics, stressing that slavery was integral to America's success as a nation--not a marginal enterprise.
