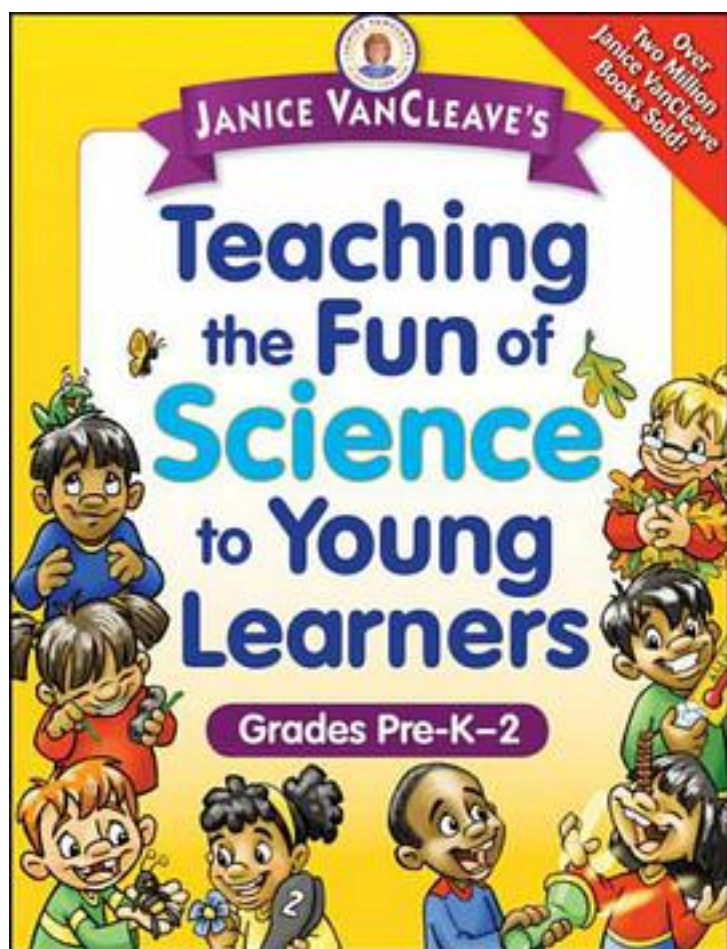


Janice VanCleave's Teaching the Fun of Science to Young Learners
