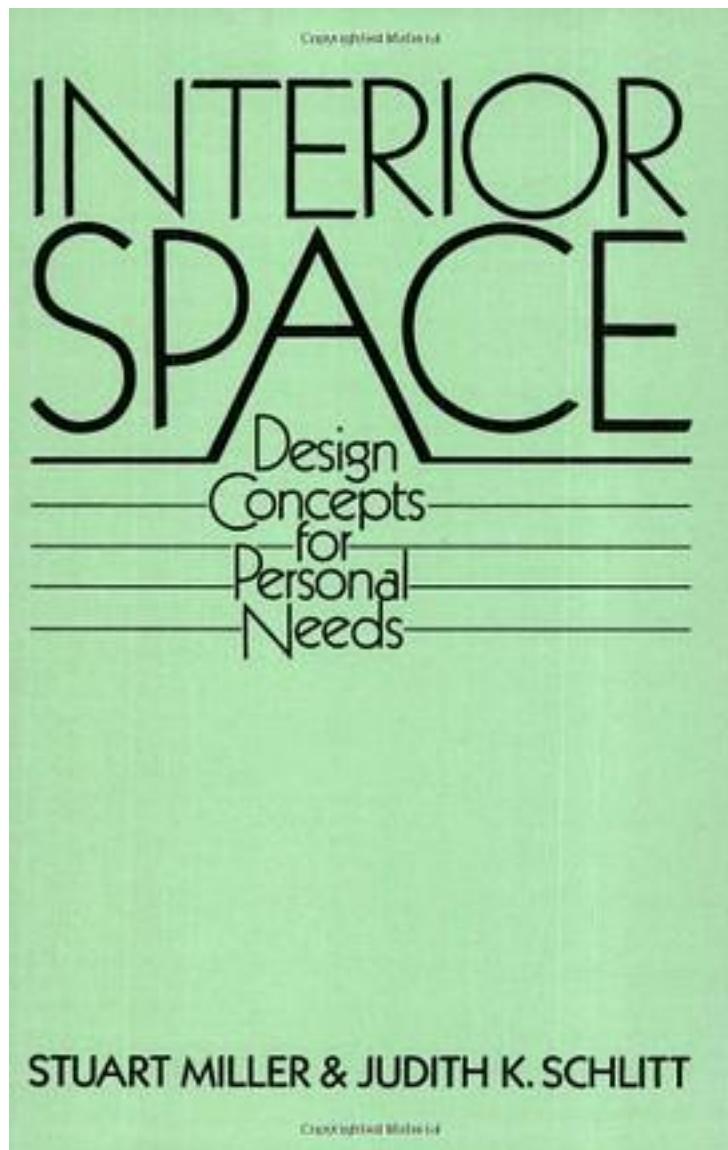


Interior Space
