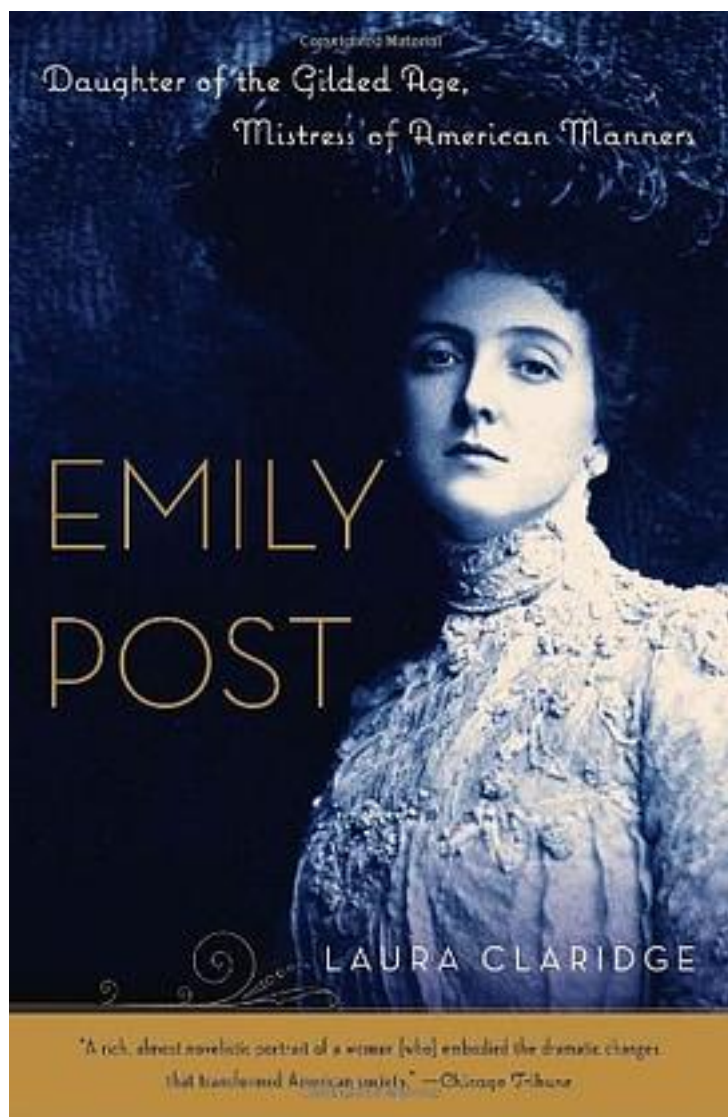


EMILY POST
