Changes in the fourth edition: relates previous Democratic education policies with President Obama's concerns with the global economy and human capital theory; highlights how Democrats came to support No Child Left Behind as a solution to civil rights issues related to schooling and Obama's quest to close the achievement gap; deals with the Democratic side of the culture wars dividing the two political parties, particularly regarding multicultural education and language issues; includes a completely new chapter on 'Teacher Agendas: Republicans and Democrats'; and, shows how the education agendas from the 2008 campaign of John McCain and Saráh Palin are compatible with previous Republican desires to protect socially conservative values in schools. "Political Agendas for Education" is essential reading for courses dealing with the politics of education, foundations of education, educational leadership, and curriculum studies, and for educational scholars, professionals, policymakers, and all those concerned with the politics of education in the U.S. and its consequences for schools and society.

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
