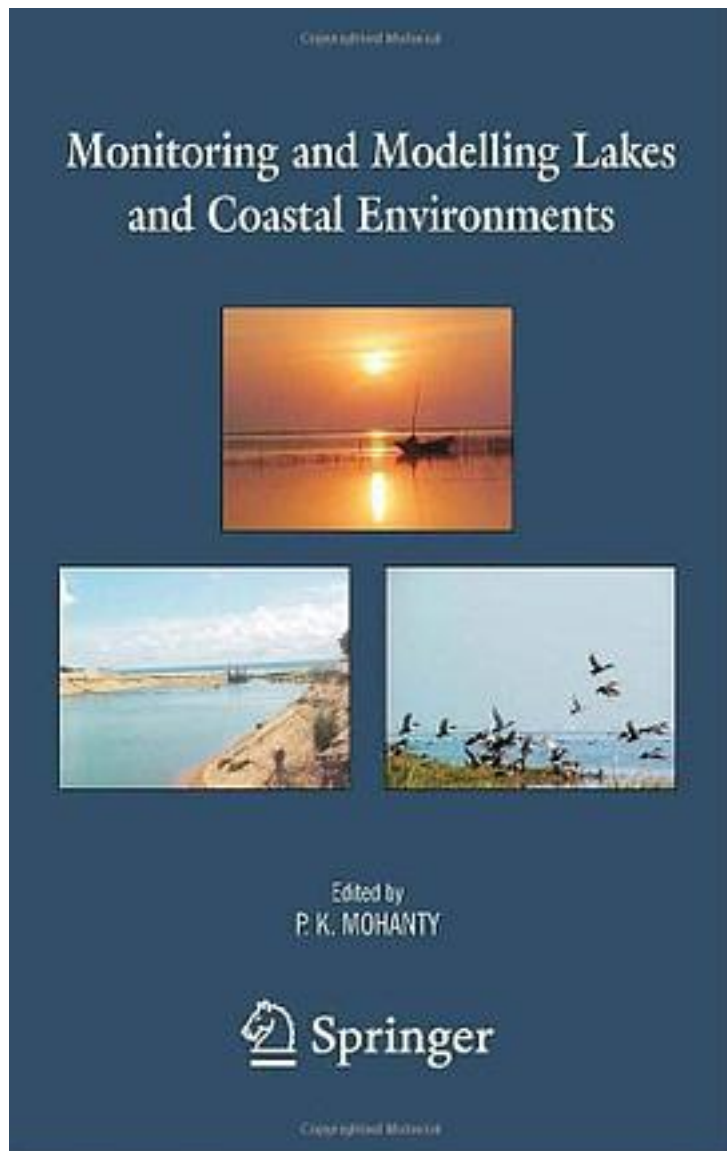


Monitoring and Modelling Lakes and Coastal Environments
