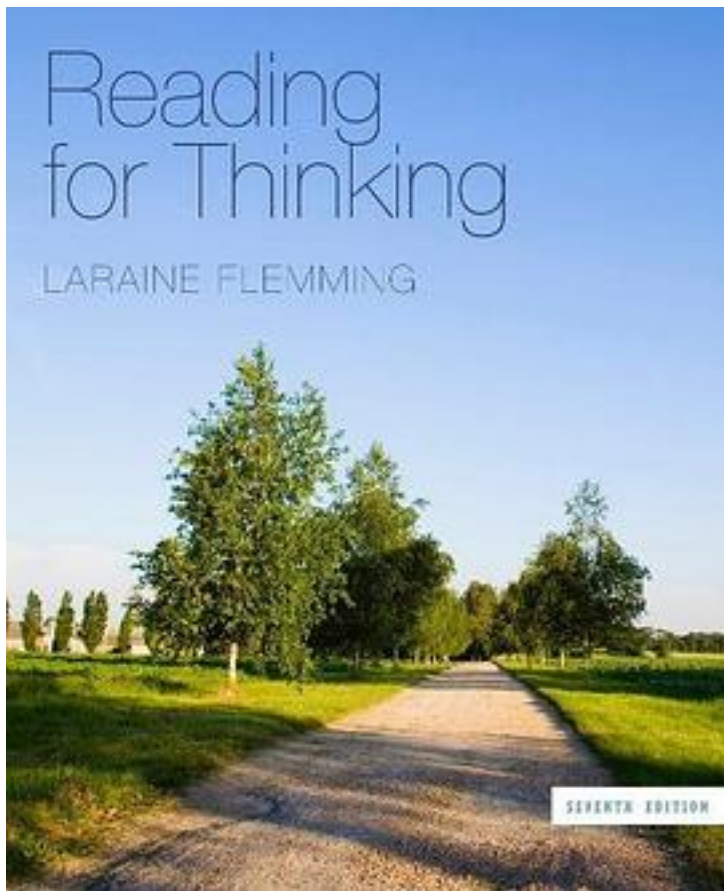


Reading for Thinking

students' comprehension and critical-thinking skills.
