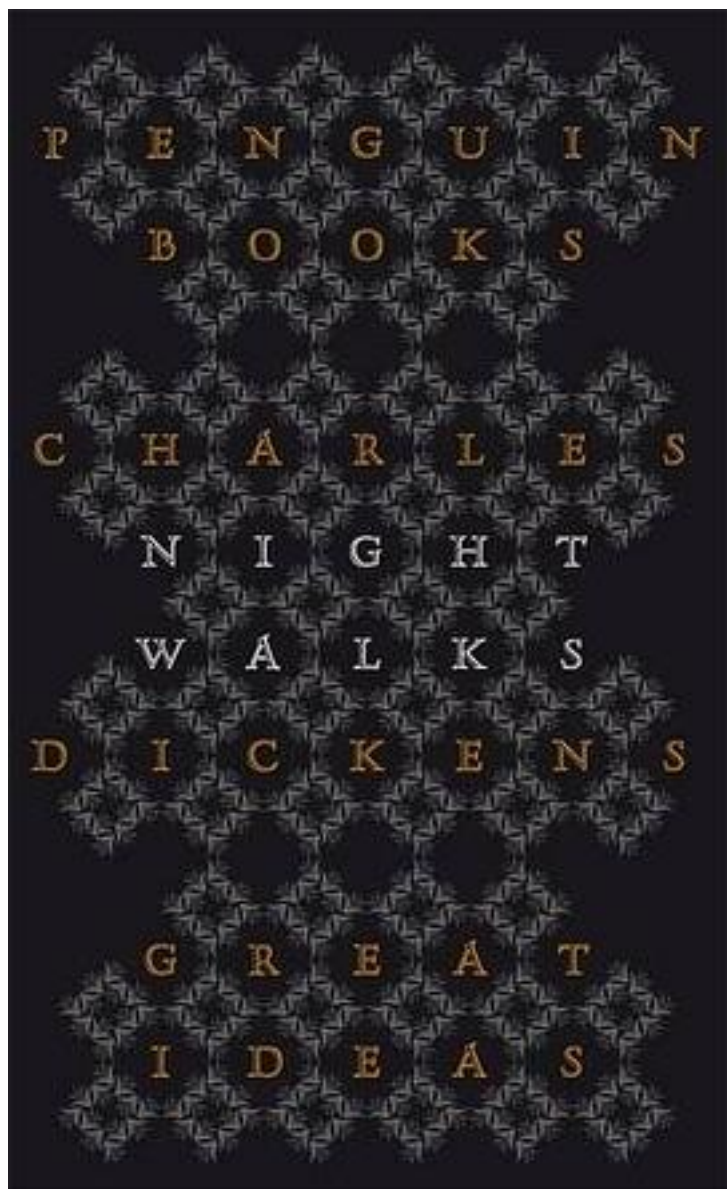


Night Walks
