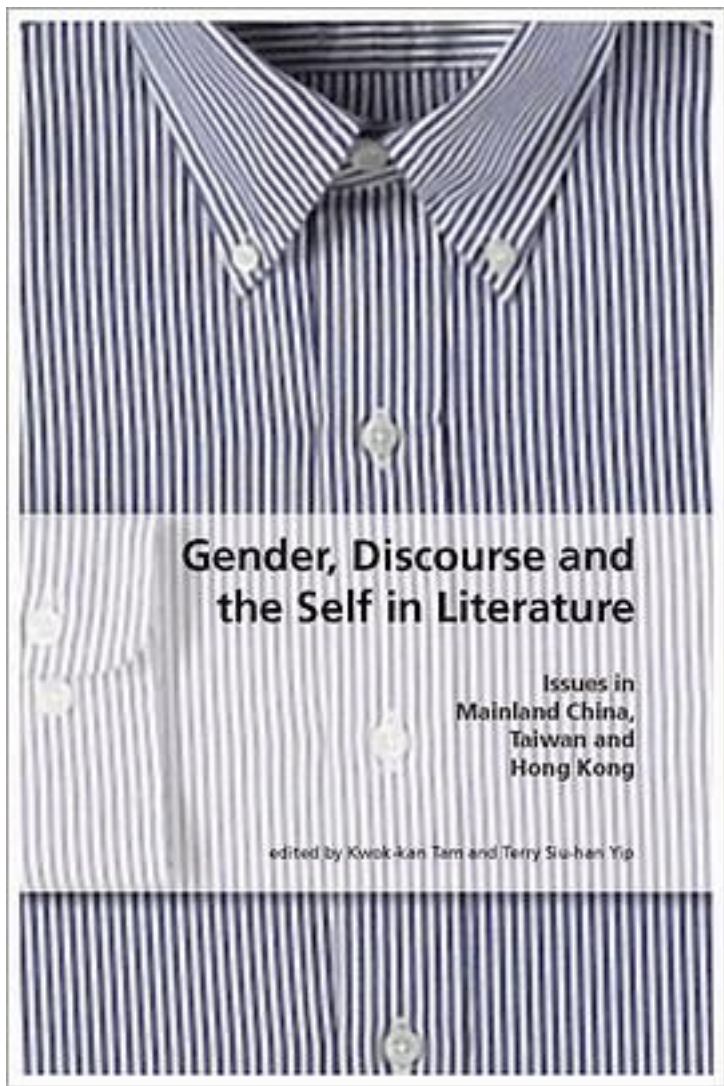


# Gender, Discourse and the Self in Literature
